

y father was a pastor in another denomination. He would preach about love but we were not receiving that love at home. He was physically abusive to our mother and us. We also struggled financially and would only have one meal a day.

Later on, I worked in a company and I met a man who I started a relationship with. We got married and everything was going well until he became abusive. He did not love and care for me. He often told me that I was useless. He once kicked me and beat me so badly that I did not see a way out of my abusive marriage. I desired to die. I just wanted to get drunk and throw myself in front of a moving car.

Things changed when my friend invited me to attend services in the Universal Church. In the church, I was taught how to pray and to fight for my life through the power of faith. During that time, my husband and I separated.

Through my perseverance in the chains of prayers, my life started changing. My finances improved and my salary was doubled at work and I was able provide for myself and family.

Although I witnessed great improvements, I was still broken inside. I felt empty. In one service, the pastor spoke about forgiveness and that touched me. I decided to forgive my late father and ex-husband. I had freedom inside of me.

The Campaign of Israel was introduced and it addressed those who wanted to become children of God. I wanted to have relationship with God, so I participated. I prayed and read my Bible everyday. I sought the Holy Spirit at every chance I got. On the last day of the campaign, I fulfilled my vow. grew up attending services in the Universal Church but I only did that to please my mother. My life, however, was not truly committed to God. I was not entirely obedient to the teachings I received in the church. When I was 13 years old, I got involved with the wrong crowd and started smoking and drinking.

I smoked crack cocaine and mandrax. I went to nightclubs where I stole people's phones and

then sold them to feed my addiction. I once drove to a club and drank heavily. On my way home, I was speeding and I lost control of the car which rolled about three times. I was physically unscathed although the car was a wreck.

That accident was enough to make me realise that my reckless lifestyle would inevitably lead me to premature death or imprisonment. Unfortunately, just two months after the incident, I faced another devastating blow as my mother passed away. I was also unemployed around that time.

I had to take a decision to change my life. I started faithfully attending the services in the church. I engaged in the chains of prayers for my complete deliverance from

addiction and indeed, I was delivered from the grip of addiction.

I also got baptised in water to symbolise my decision to start a new life in God's presence. When the Campaign of Israel was introduced in the church, I saw an opportunity to change my life. I participated the campaign in Ι made my sacrifice for my inner transformation.

I fasted. I read my Bible and woke up at night to seek the Holy Spirit. I was sincere with God. I attended a service and I sought the Holy Spirit. I wanted to live only for God. During the prayer, I had peace and I was happy. From that day, things were never the same.

I no longer have a desire to smoke or drink alcohol. I no longer go to nightclubs. I have my own business of supplying mines with mine materials. I am happily married

was raised by my grandmother because my parents were absent from my life. This affected me emotionally to a point that I started having hallucinations.



One evening, I was listening to the Stop Suffering programme of the Universal Church on the radio and I heard a testimony from someone who had a similar problem that I had and overcame. The next morning, I looked for the church.

When I arrived in the church, a pastor counselled me. He encouraged me to attend the service on Sunday and I did so. I participated in the chains of prayers for my deliverance from hallucinations, depression and addiction.

I also understood that in order for me to live a fulfilled life, I had to commit myself to God. I got baptised in water to mark the start of a new life in the presence of God.

What is a Chain of Prayer?

A Chain of Prayer is a biblical method of achieving blessings – and it really works! It has worked for thousands of people and will work for you. No matter how big your problem is, use your faith. Give God proof of your commitment by being faithful in the Chain and you will see how much God will do for you.
